



# **Example with**"Int'l Studies Foundation Courses"

**Credit requirement: 18 credits** 

You have obtained: 20 credits

20 - 18 credits = 2 additional credits



**Count towards 12-credit requirement** 



#### Example 1.

#### If you have:

4 additional credits in Int'l Studies Foundation Courses

8 additional credits in Int'l Studies Advanced Courses

12 credits towards 12-credit requirement

# Example with "Optional Courses"

**Credit requirement: 0 credits** 

You have obtained: 10 credits



Count towards 20-credit requirement

requirement

- → If interested, check the timetable at the SIS Office.


